Community Engagement

- Front Office* – Answer phones, welcome and direct visitors at Coastal Rivers Round Top Farm
- Outreach and/or Events* – Help with Coastal Rivers hosted events (parking, set-up, registration, etc.), or represent Coastal Rivers at outreach events
- Photography* – Take professional photos of volunteer activities, programs, preserves, wildlife, etc.

Stewardship – Coastal Rivers Properties and Easements

- Bittersweet Brigade* – Tackle invasive plants on our preserves during weekly work parties
- Preserve Steward* – Monitor one or more Coastal Rivers preserves, light maintenance, report to staff
- Trail TamersSM* – Take part in monthly trail work parties May through October
- Conservation Easement Monitor* – Visit one or more Coastal Rivers easements once a year to check for compliance and complete a brief report

Grounds & Facilities

- Boat and/or Small Equipment* – Help maintain our boats (used for water quality monitoring, monitoring island preserves, and education); help maintain small equipment such as lawnmowers and chainsaws
- Carpentry and/or painting* – Assist with projects or repairs
- Gardening/Landscaping* – Help maintain Coastal Rivers pollinator gardens (various locations)
- Mowing* – Use riding mower on lawns and trails at Round Top Farm, Salt Bay Farm and other Preserves

Education

- Education Program Support* – Assist with nature education programs for adults and/or kids
- Education Docent* – Welcome and engage visitors at Coastal Rivers Salt Bay Farm and/or Beachcombers' Discovery Center at Pemaquid Beach Park

Environmental

- Water Quality Monitoring (estuary, beach/freshwater)* – Monitor water quality from May to October in various locations including the Damariscotta River Estuary, Pemaquid Beach, Bristol Mills, and the beach at Biscay Pond. *Estuary monitoring requires adequate balance to safely board and travel by motor boat*
- Horseshoe Crab Monitoring* – Help count horseshoe crabs from May to June in Great Salt Bay during spawning season. *Must be able to safely navigate a rocky embankment and walk in knee-deep water*
- Courtesy Boat Inspector (CBI)* – Conduct voluntary boat inspections to help prevent the introduction of invasive species in lakes and ponds
- Invasive Plant Patrol* – Monitor lake or pond shorelines for potentially invasive plants and collect suspicious plant samples for analysis
- Phytoplankton Monitoring* – Collect and identify phytoplankton in support of the Maine Department of Marine Resource’s effort to provide a first-alert system for potentially toxic phytoplankton
- Midden Minder* – Monitor shell middens to document change over time related to human activities, storm events and sea level change
- Frost Fish Survey Volunteer* – From mid-December into early January, document observations of frost fish (aka tomcod) during spawning season

Other

- Twin Villages Foodbank Farm* – Help grow and distribute vegetables for local food pantries
