**Community Engagement**

- Front Office* – Answer phones, welcome and direct visitors at our Coastal Rivers Round Top Farm headquarters.
- Outreach and/or Events* – Setup, parking, greeting, clean-up, represent Coastal Rivers at outreach events etc.
- Photography* – Take professional photos of volunteer activities, programs and events, local flora and fauna etc.

**Stewardship – Coastal Rivers Properties and Easements**

- Bittersweet Brigade* – Tackle invasive plants on our preserves at weekly work parties.
- Preserve Steward* – Monitor one or more Coastal Rivers preserves, light maintenance, report to staff.
- Trail Tamers<sup>SM</sup>* – Monthly work parties from May to October to build or maintain trails.
- Conservation Easement Monitor* – Visit one or more Coastal Rivers easements once a year to check for compliance and complete a brief report.
- Cleanups* – Be a part of annual cleanups, along the road and shorelines, at a preserve, or on the river.

**Grounds & Facilities**

- Boat and/or Small Equipment* – Help maintain our boats which are used for water quality monitoring and monitoring our island preserves; help maintain small equipment such as lawnmowers, chainsaws etc.
- Carpentry and/or painting* – Assist with projects or repairs.
- Gardening/Landscaping* – Care for Coastal Rivers flower gardens or the butterfly garden at Pemaquid Beach Park.
- Mowing* – Use riding mower on lawns and trails at Round Top Farm, Salt Bay Farm and other Preserves.

**Education**

- Education Program Support* – Assist with teaching programs for adults and/or children.
- Beachcombers' Discovery Center at Pemaquid Beach Park* – Provide education and outreach.

## Environmental

- Water Quality Monitoring (estuary, beach/freshwater)* – Monitor water quality from May to October in the Damariscotta River Estuary, Pemaquid River, Pemaquid Beach, Great Salt Bay, Biscay Pond, and tributaries. Estuary monitoring requires adequate balance to safely board and travel by motor boat.
- Horseshoe Crab Monitoring* – Help count horseshoe crabs from May to June in Great Salt Bay during spawning season. Requires the ability to safely navigate a rocky embankment and walk in knee-deep water.
- Courtesy Boat Inspector (CBI)* – Conduct voluntary boat inspections to help prevent the introduction of invasive species in Pemaquid and Biscay Pond.
- Invasive Plant Patrol* – Monitor lake or pond shorelines for potentially invasive plants and collect suspicious plant samples for analysis.
- Phytoplankton Monitoring* – Collect and identify phytoplankton in support of the Maine Department of Marine Resource’s effort to provide a first-alert system for potentially toxic phytoplankton.
- Midden Minder* – Monitor shell middens to document change related to human activities, storm events and sea level change
- Frost Fish Survey Volunteer* – Help us gather data on the important, but not well documented Tomcod fish, also known as Frost Fish. Monitor where, when, and how many Tomcods are spawning to better understand how well they are doing here in Maine. (mid-Dec to early January)

## Other

- Twin Villages Foodbank Farm* – Help to grow and distribute vegetables for local food pantries.
